Autumn has begun as the children start to observe the changes and enjoy the spoils of the horse chestnut trees! Rabbits have been learning about how different faiths celebrate the birth of a new baby in the family.

Foxes continued to explore their box of artifacts from Farnham museum. This week they enjoyed a visit from someone who remembers these artifacts being used when he was younger.

I do have a few reminders this week to share.

Please can we ask you to be prompt in delivering children and collecting children. This includes from clubs at the end of the day. Being 5 or 10 minutes late on a regular basis either arriving or collecting your child is not acceptable for many reasons but most of all it affects your child. Whether that is arriving late in the morning and missing the settling in period so they go straight into a lesson, or at the end of the day when they see all their peers go home and they are worried about being collected. Thank you for helping us to help your child.

On another note please can you be courteous as well as ensuring safeguarding is a priority, when entering school during the school day. This week we had several incidents of people who had buzzed in, spoken to the office so the gate was opened for them, and they were rudely overtaken by another parent who hadn't spoken with the office. This puts people in a very difficult position, when they are trying to adhere to best safeguarding practices. If you are arriving at the gate and someone else has had the gate opened for them you must still speak with the office on the intercom to alert them to your arrival.

Lastly a lovely team of parents have got road safety on the agenda and are working with the Parish council to see if more can be done. We tell children that they cannot leave the school gate without holding a grown-ups hand. Please can you reinforce this as well. Again I am mentioning as it was noted that children were out of the gate without a parent this week. Please be vigilant.






