<u>The Churt Yuletide Bazaar</u> is being hosted by two Mums from St Johns, to celebrate the wealth of talent that we have, in and around the local area of Churt. Rebecca Harvey-Browne, who set up her business Dobby & Rose two years ago, lives in the village and creates handwoven lampshades and cushions but also teaches others the skill of weaving. Angie Hedgecock, who lives just out of the village in Beacon Hill, is a very skilled and talented Wildlife portrait artist and is also commissioned to draw pet portraits.

The idea of creating an event started after a discussion, which highlighted how high end artisans and makers can struggle to sell and promote their craft to the community around them. It was then decided that the best way to do this, was to create an event which would showcase not only small business owners within Churt and the surrounds, but also one that would bring the community together to celebrate what we have to offer.

It was decided in the early stages of planning, that all proceeds raised from the event, would be given back to the community; to the School and Village Hall.

On the day of the Bazaar, inside you will find high quality gifts produced by a blacksmith, jewellers, pencil artists, a ceramicist and of course, there will be some Christmas decorations!

In addition, there will be warm food and drink outside, all provided by local businesses.

Not only that, there will also be two pre-bookable workshops; wreath making and for those truly getting into the festive spirit, a cocktail making workshop hosted by the Bel and The Dragon. Nearly every penny that is raised from the Workshops will come back to the school, therefore get together with friends and come and have a fab evening learning a new skill and have fun whilst doing it!

Entertainment will be provided throughout to make it a very special Churt Christmas celebration!
