Please can we ask everyone if you haven't already to consider looking into your child's vaccinations and ensuring they are up to date. Two doses of the MMR vaccine gives 99% protection against measles. If children have received both doses of the vaccine (at 12 months old and then at 3 years and 4 months old), they are unlikely to have the virus. For adults, it is never too late to catch up on any missed MMR vaccinations. People should contact their GP practice to book an appointment. <u>What should I do If I think my child has measles?</u>
