It's the end of another busy week and half-term is approaching quickly. This week, the children have focused on what outstanding, exemplary behaviour looks like. As part of this we have talked about ways in which we greet people and how we respond to adults and our friends in and around school. Many of you will have heard your children talk about the symbols we use to help the children recognise their behaviour and where it lies on our scale of expectations. The very best behaviour is symbolised by a rainbow. As part of our Behaviour for Learning Policy we have introduced a "pot of gold" that sits at the end of our rainbow symbol to recognise consistent, outstanding behaviour in our school. Examples of consistent outstanding behaviour might be demonstrating our Christian core values by consistently being polite and courteous, listening and responding appropriately in our school environment, etc. When children reach this pot of gold, a note will be brought home to celebrate this wonderful achievement.
