Proposed Admission Criteria for 2019/2020

- 1 Looked after children and previously looked after children (see note 1).
- 2 Children with exceptional circumstances, documented medical or social needs (see note 2).
- 3 Children who have a sibling(s) at school at the time of the closing date for applications (see note 3).

To now read:

Children who have or who have had a sibling(s) attending St John's (see note 3).

- 4 Children of staff who are on the payroll or who satisfy a skills shortage (see note 4).
- 5 Children for whom St John's is the nearest school admitting pupils of the same age (see note 5).
- 6 Children for whom St John's is not the nearest school but who are, in priority order:
 - (a) children of parent(s) who are regular worshippers (see note 6) at St John's the Evangelist Church, Churt with Rushmoor; and
 - (b) children of parents(s) who are regular worshippers (see note 6) at a Christian church of any denomination.
- 7 Children whose parents wish them to attend this church school.

Don't hesitate to talk to me with any questions you may have or if you need more information.
