"Keeping Safe" Week

Farnham Library - Summer Reading Challenge

Our local library staff have been telling the children how to take part in *Mischief Makers*, this year's Summer Reading Challenge.

All the children need to do is register at their local Surrey Library, read 6 library books and visit the library regularly over the holidays, collecting stickers and incentives along the way.

Children's reading can 'dip' during the holidays if they don't have regular access to books and encouragement to read for pleasure. There is no other

free reading activity that involves so many children, introduces families to their library, encourages children to choose books freely and independently, and is endorsed by parents, teachers and the Department for Education.

Please encourage your children to visit the library and sign up over the holidays and see the difference the summer reading challenge makes for them.



Attendance

Attendance is a key issue for schools as the Local Authority, Government and Ofsted continue to use attendance data to monitor schools. It is also vital for children to have good attendance in order to access full learning sequences, not to miss elements of the curriculum and ensure that their progress remains on track. Children with poor attendance fall behind and miss learning opportunities.

Our school attendance is lower than expected, mainly due to the number of children being taken out of school during term time for holidays. The Local Authority Education Welfare Officer is monitoring our school very closely and we hope that there will be an improvement in attendance, especially from the start of the new academic year.

More information will be given out at the start of the Autumn Term. Letters are now being sent to individual parents if there is a concern about attendance and meetings could be arranged with the Educational Welfare Officer in the future. If you would like to discuss any concerns about school attendance, please come and talk to me.

Medicines

As part of our policy on supporting children with medical conditions, we will administer prescribed medicines with in date pharmacists' labels assigned to the child. This means that children should not under any circumstances bring their own medicines into school. Please can you bring the medicine to Mrs Marshall at the office desk and she will be able to provide a consent form for you to complete. At the end of the day, if the medicine needs to go home, please collect it from Mrs Marshall. Thank you for your help.
