## Dear Parents

It has been an incredibly busy week this week, especially for our teachers. Over the past two weeks we have all had some fabulous training on a range of practical strategies to use with our children, to help keep them on-task and motivated. It has, as always, been great teaching and observing teaching. What is becoming increasingly evident is the skilled ways in which teachers set different challenges to suit all our learners. Our children are starting to become really good at editing and reflecting on their work, and understanding what they need to do to improve.
