# Reading Policy

## The system for changing individual reading books

The system for changing individual reading books is clearly laid out towards the end of the Policy on pages 3 and 4.

**Children in Yr 2** should be changing their individual reading books independently in the morning on arrival at school. This is an important skill for the children to learn as they prepare to move into Yr 3. Please see the procedures for Rabbits and Foxes in the Policy.

Whilst children can be confident, fluent readers, and need encouragement to move appropriately through the reading system, it is important to remember that the development of comprehension skills is crucial. Comprehension skills often need to be developed and reinforced even when the children appear to be confident in a specific stage in their reading. At home, it would be helpful to spend time asking children about what they have read. Although your child may have read the text fluently, questions about what they have read beginning with 'why' and 'how' will help to develop inference and deduction.

As a school, we are currently working on a range of questions that will help to support the development of comprehension skills and be able to support reading at home. These will be ready for circulation in the Autumn Term.

Please can you also help us by making sure that your child's reading diary comes to school every day – thank you.

### Post Box

We are very fortunate to have a secure post box outside the front entrance of our school and would like to use it more regularly. We have been thinking of ways to speed up giving information to the school office, especially in the mornings, when queues can be become quite long! If you have something that just needs to be dropped off, please consider using the post box. Please ensure any correspondence or information has your child's name and class on it. Thank you for your help.
