What a great week back! We have finally taken delivery of the remaining furniture for the library, re-stocked shelves and are ready to go. We will be celebrating the official opening of the library next Thursday, 9 November, during the day, but we would love all parents to be involved after school where we will be holding a Scholastic book sale in the library, and the PTA will be serving milk and cookies!

Also, with regard to next Thursday's official library opening, can I please draw your attention to the note from the PTA, under our "news items for this week" section at the foot of this newsletter regarding a new fundraising initiative, and a great way to set positive examples to our children.

Through very generous donations from yourselves, and last year's Badger Class, not only have we been able to buy furniture but also we have purchased a large number of new sets of books for Guided Reading Groups. We have a great system going of a fantastic range of different texts with a wide variety of differentiated questions and challenging higher order questions. Children's reading at St John's is excellent, with 90% of our children achieving Exp/Greater Depth in reading in 2016/17. However, as a school, we believe there is enormous value in discussion, questioning, hearing and using a rich, wide vocabulary and the undoubted benefit in extending and expanding wonderful imaginations! I could keep going but, building on all these skills and listening to each other in groups, is just a perfect way to learn. A massive thank you to all those of you who have made this possible.

Whilst I see how important it is that families spend quality time with each other in relaxed, "untime scheduled" situations, I would please urge you to do all you can to ensure that holidays are only taken during school holidays. Children and teachers do find it a challenge getting up to speed again when children return to school and, of course, valuable whole class learning experiences have been missed.
