Online Safety

We are writing to bring to your attention a popular animated film currently trending among children and young people: K-Pop Demon Hunters, available on Netflix. While the film has gained widespread popularity and features catchy music and vibrant animation, it also contains themes and imagery that may not be suitable for young children.

Key Concerns:

Age Rating: The film is rated PG (unsuitable for younger viewers). It includes stylized action, supernatural battles, and mild suggestive content. Some reviews giving it an advisory of 10 years and over.

Violence and Scary Imagery: The story involves demon hunting, magical combat, and scenes that may be intense or frightening for younger or sensitive viewers.

D	Universal. Suitable for everyone, and contains no content unsuitable for children.
25	Parental Guidance. Contains content unsuitable for younger children.
12A	Cinema rating only. Those aged 12 and under should be accompanied by an adult.
12	Unsuitable for under-12s. No sales to anyone under the age of 12.
15	Unsuitable for under-15s. No sales/entry to anyone under the age of 15.

Spiritual Themes: The film draws on elements of Korean mythology and shamanistic rituals, which may conflict with some families' spiritual or religious values.

Suggestive Material: There are moments of flirtation and idolisation of physical appearance, which may prompt discussions around body image and relationships.

Emotional Themes: The narrative explores fame, identity, and inner conflict, which may be complex for younger children to process without guidance.

While some families have found the film enjoyable and even inspiring, others have raised concerns about its deeper themes.

We encourage all parents to preview the film before allowing children to watch it. Peer pressure and just because someone else has watched it doesn't make it appropriate for everyone.

As always, our priority is the wellbeing and development of our pupils. Whilst it is your decision as to whether your children watch the material, it seems key to point out, they then proceed to discuss it with their peers or create games based on this in the playground. We will not be promoting discussion or play on this genre of film/tv as is not appropriate for our school community.

We are aiming to provide further information to parents this year on the effects of the online world for infant age children and setting them up with healthy habits now can help them, and you in the future.




