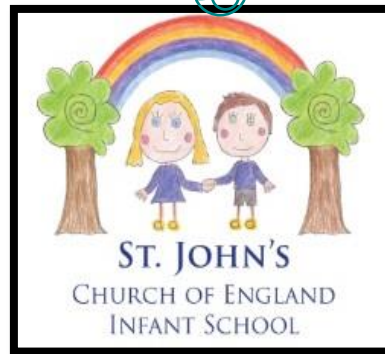

Fire and Ice



English

In English we will be writing recounts of the Great fire of London based on the facts that we have learnt. We will also be looking at the life of Samuel Pepys and writing a biography of his life. We will then compare London from 1666 to now. Another focus will be our class book 'Charlotte's web', we will be discussing the story and creating character descriptions from the story.

London and its landmarks.

Mathematics

In maths we will be focusing on multiplication and division before moving onto statistic and carrying out our own surveys. After this we will move onto shape and this will include both 2D and 3D shapes and their properties, as well as looking at symmetry. The term will finish with fractions and finding $\frac{1}{3}$, $\frac{1}{4}$, $\frac{2}{4}$ and $\frac{3}{4}$ of a length, shape and set of objects or quantity.

Science

For science we will be discovering which animals live in hot and cold places as well as creating fact files based on research that each child will carry out on a chosen animal. At Forest School we will be looking at different classes of animals as well as looking at the weather.

RE

In R.E we will be learning about different parables. We will be thinking about what a Christian is, why Jesus told parables, why the bible is an important book and why the angels announced the birth of Jesus.

PE

During outdoor P.E lessons we will be focussing of different throwing and catching featured in different sports before we play versions of these games to help us work in teams and think tactically.

PSHE

This term we are looking at the Wheel of wellbeing in PSHE. We are exploring our emotions and what makes us happy and what makes us sad and how we can use strategies to overcome sadness. We will then be looking at different factors about how to keep ourselves and others well.

Geography/History

History will be surrounded by learning about the Great Fire of London covered in English. For Geography we will be exploring hot and cold countries in relation to the equator and thinking about the differences in weather.

Art/DT

In art we will be looking at houses from the time of the great fire of London. We will be creating our own houses as well as creating orange skies based on the work of the artist William Turner. We will then move on to drawing pictures of animals to reflect our science work.

Music/Computing

Music will be thinking about the features of music which represent fire and ice and composing our own piece. Computing will be linked with researching different animals from around the world.
