How To Love Reading With Your Child!

Play I Spy

Can you find words beginning with...?

Can you find a picture of a ...?

How many...can you see?

Ask questions

Ask questions about the text e.g. what was the story about? How would you describe the main character? Why did that happen? What do you think will happen next?

Be seen!

Make sure you are seen reading! And keep books around the house on view. Perhaps even have a 'family bookshelf'?



Make it fun!

Read a variety of texts-magazines, newspapers.

Act out the story.

Let your child choose their own book.

Create a reading space.

Read aloud.

Sit close together

You could encourage your child to hold the book themselves and turn the pages, too.
