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As a very small school we take a targeted individual approach to our pupil premium expenditure, focusing on the academic progress and emotional well-being of our disadvantaged pupils. The funding enables us to teach children individually, in pairs or in groups as well as help them engage fully in school life through educational trips and after school clubs when they choose.
