Warning	 Swiftly leave the site through the staff carpark, you must exit the grounds and outside the school gates promptly to allow the next group safe space and alleviate parking. When exiting via the staff carpark all children should be supervised by the adult collecting them at all times. It is steep. No climbing on the wall. No cycling or scootering in the carpark or down the slope. Please remain vigilant when exiting the premises.
Afterschool	 Clubs need to be booked in advance – no last minute care available (records need to be kept) The government recommendation is that parents limit the number of provisions attended. We would suggest that if playdates are taking place they be with those families within your class bubble. If suspected case of COVID-19 in pupil	 Book a test https://www.gov.uk/get-coronavirus-test or ring 119 Ring 111 if concerned about your child's illness or 999 if they deteriorate. Ring school to inform us your child is unwell stating the symptoms and that you have booked a test. You and your family should begin isolating until you get the result. Inform school as soon as you have your result. (including weekends office@stjohns-farnham.surrey.sch.uk)
If suspected case of COVID-19 in family member	 Book a test https://www.gov.uk/get-coronavirus-test or ring 119 Ring 111 if concerned about their illness or 999 if they deteriorate. Ring school to inform us, your family should begin isolating until you get the result. Inform school as soon as you have your result. (including weekends vial email)
In case of a positive test result for pupil or family member	 Ring school to inform (including weekends via email office@stjohns-farnham.surrey.sch.uk) Self-isolate the whole family for 14 days (10 days for the patient) Follow medical advice, seek medical help if symptoms worsen. Engage with NHS track and trace https://www.gov.uk/guidance/nhs-test-and-trace-how-it-works
In case of a negative result	 The pupil may return to school as soon as they are well, with no fever. If family member is negative the family can stop isolating and child may return to school.

<u>We cannot/will not name pupils or staff members</u> who may need a test or receive positive test results, however we will inform people when relevant information is available for those pupils with medical conditions or households with extremely or clinically vulnerable adults. This is to allow them to make the most informed decision on the best course of action about school attendance for their child/children.

We hope this information is clear and helpful, we do hope to reassure you with these measures in place opening school to all children is possible, it takes everyone to make this work, to be responsible for our actions, to support each other, to be honest, to be kind and to ensure we keep each other safe.
