<p>Key Knowledge (According to RWI grouping) Know all set 1 sounds m, a, s, d, t, I, n, p, g, o, c, k, u, b, f, e, l, h, sh, ck, r, j, v, y, w, th, z, ch, qu, x, ng, nk</p> <p>Key Skills I can read letter sounds by saying the sound for the grapheme. I can blend letter sounds to make CVC words (man) I can read texts using known phonic sounds. I can segment cvc words into the letter sounds (m-a-n) I can use Fred Fingers I can use the sounds I know to write simple words/captions I can read and write my name independently I use a dominant hand developing a tripod grip. Number names in order from 1-10/20. Understand the purpose of counting – to find how many. Know that the last number in the count tells us how many (cardinality). Know that whole numbers can be split into parts e.g. 3 is made of 1 and 2. Know the composition of numbers 1-7. Understand the vocabulary more/fewer and the same (equal). 3D shape names and properties.</p> <p>Key Skills I can verbally count forward and back to 10. I can count using 1:1 correspondence. I can use a 10 frame to show an amount from 1-10. I can use perceptual subitising up to 5/6 and conceptual subitising for larger amounts (seeing sub-groups). I can compare sets of objects. Match numerals to quantities in order.</p> <p>Key Vocabulary More, fewer, the same, equal, count, number names 0 to 10, order, forwards, backwards, 10 frame, die frame, sphere, pyramid, cone, cube, faces, corners.</p>		<p>Key Knowledge- Know that matter can change state due to temperature – water – ice Understand the need to respect and care for the natural environment and all living things.
